Minutes of December Board Meeting

These are the minutes of the January 11, 2005 meeting of the Indy Region BOD. Present at the meeting were: Matt Curry, Dick Powell, Rich Lankford, Steve Linn, Lou Byer, Darren Daubenspeck, Jim Lin, Andy Weldon, Chris McGuire, Rick Swarts, Cheryl Swarts, Candice Pope, Frank Pope, Alyson Kunack, John Wilmoth, Velma Boreen, and Joel Harleman

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

Treasurers Report Frank Pope distributed copies of the 2004 summary. Net increase for 2004 is 12,620. Frank suggested that for the future, the previous treasurer assist in preparation of the corporate taxes.

Membership Steve will assemble a new-member packet, and an interested inquiry response packet.

Solo CenDiv solo: budget will be similar to last year. We may be able to reduce rental by doing some facility maintenance activities. Rick will keep us informed of when we could have a workday. Committee is projecting a profit with 180 entries. Event is scheduled for August 13-14, 2005. First meeting of the committee and interested parties will be Jan 25, 7 PM.

Darren has been approached by a marque club to help run a Solo event at IRP. The marque club would be paying the site rental. Steve noted; we could rent them our equipment and man the course. We would not pay fees and would be able to compete.

Rally Candice needs rallymasters for the year. She presented a tentative schedule for the year with 6 rallies, and presented a budget proposal based on 6 events. We expect to continue with the \$5 Ad discount program.

Race Jeanne Spellman is the Race Program Chair, and is looking for event chairs for the races.

Andy Weldon and Terrence Garrett visited IRP on the 11th, looking for potential locations for timing and scoring. Possibilities include the south tower at the start of the dragstrip overlooking turn 15, and the main tower overlooking the turn 8-9 area as a new start-finish. Terrence is going to

evaluate the existing tower for possible refurbishment, and present a proposal. Andy reported that the SCCA HQ is most interested and desires to keep the existing S/F location if at all possible.

Clutch Chatter Dick presented a proposed budget for the year, based on 12 issues of 24 pages, with a 28 page July issue for the Race Program. Articles need to be in by the 21st to get the February issue on time.

Activities Lou Byer asked for suggestions for possible club activities. Alyson suggested a trip to the Detroit Auto Show again next year. Other suggestions were the Hollywood Film Works and Legacy Motors Art Gallery in Chi-

Old Business Indy Region Awards Points Rules changes were proposed and reviewed, approved by BOD. Dick will print the changes and distribute them by email for further review prior to publishing in February Clutch Chatter.

Area 4 incorporation. The 9 racing regions will split the incorporation fees. Motion to pay 1/9 carried unanimously. New Business CenDiv Spring Training will be at the Clarion Waterfront Hotel on March 4-5, 2005. Indy Region could have a hospitality area. Will discuss further at next meeting.

Next meeting scheduled for February 15th. The Fountain Square Diner has been suggested as a possible meeting location. Rich Lankford and Dick Powell will check out the possibility and let the group know.

Meeting was adjourned.

2005 Indianapolis Region Awards Points Rules

RACING AWARDS

Purpose: To recognize the maximum number of Indianapolis Region of Record members by presenting year-end racing awards.

The awards and their criteria are as follows:

- The Hergenroether Award is the premier road racing award in Indianapolis Region. It shall be presented to the outstanding competition driver on the basis of attitude, sportsmanship, and competitiveness as selected by previous recipients of this award.
- 2. The Rookie of the Year Award will be presented to the competitor accumulating the highest total points, awarded per GCR, for the best six finishes in regional and/or national events counting for Indianapolis Region points as defined in Rules 3 and 4 below. The competitor must:
 - a. have never previously held an SCCA racing license and
 - b. begin the season on a Novice Permit and meet National license requirements during the season.
- 3. Regional trophies shall be awarded for the 1st through 5th places on the following basis:
 - a. Points will be accumulated per GCR for the best six regional event finishes of which no more than two may be outside of Central Division.
 - b. Rules 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 will apply.
- National trophies shall be awarded for the 1st through 5th places on the following bases:
 - a. Points will be accumulated per GCR for the best six national finishes in a single class, of which no more than two may be outside of Central Division. Finishes at the SCCA National Championship Runoffs will be considered an out of division finish.
 - b. Rules 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 will apply.
- A driver will be eligible for only one National and only one Regional racing award, but may receive one at each level.
- 6. All activities covered under a unique sanction number shall be considered to be a single event.
- If during the conduct of a single event multiple opportunities exist for a class to race, only one race will be permitted to count for points. If the format consists of preliminary races (e.g., qualifying race) followed by a feature race, only the feature race shall be counted. If the format consists of a special race for some classes (e.g., handicap, enduro) in addition to a normal race equal in length to that provided for all other classes, the race of normal length shall be counted. In the case that a class receives only one opportunity to race during an event, that race shall be counted, even if it is not of the same length as the races afforded to other classes.
- The points standings will be published at mid-season and at the end of the year in Clutch Chatter.
- It shall be the responsibility of each driver to supply the pointskeeper with results throughout the season.

SOLO II AWARDS

- 1. Class championship year-end awards will be presented as follows:
 - a. Within each class defined in the current National Solo II Rules, as well as any defined regional level classes as published in the SCCA SportsCar magazine or Indianapolis Region Clutch Chatter. Indianapolis Region regional level class rules and/or event supplemental regulations may be used to further clarify scoring issues.
 - b. Class championship points will be awarded based on official results as follows:

c. Class championship trophies shall be awarded to eligible Indianapolis Region members using the following Total number of SCCA member entries in the class for the season, divided by the number of points events in the season. Non-points events using normal classes will be included for the total number of entries in the season. This result (rounded up to the nearest whole number) is the average size of the class, and the number of class awards will be determined using the following distribution:

1 to 3	1
4 to 6	2
7 to 9	3
10 to 12	4
13 or more	5

- 2. Year-end qualifications for Class Championships:
 - a. Must be an Indianapolis Region member before the start of the final points event of the season. Anyone who joins before the start of the final points event of the season will receive points for events run during the season as a non-member. Proof of membership must be submitted to the Solo Chairman. Anyone who joins after the start of the final event of the season will receive points only for events run after joining. If the final event of the season should be cancelled, points will not be awarded to non-members unless proof of Indianapolis Region membership is presented to the Solo Chairman showing valid membership before the day of the cancelled final event. Proof of membership must be presented within two weeks after the scheduled date of the cancelled event.
 - b. The member must compete in one given class in 50% of the region's Solo II points events. (Round up for odd number of events.)
 - c. The member's best finishes in 70% of the region's Solo II points events will be counted. (rounded up to the nearest whole number.) This allows for non-attendance at a certain number of points event without penalty.
 - d. Ties for year-end points will be broken on the basis of quality of finishes in the members events used to decide year end points, i.e. most number of firsts, most number of seconds, etc. Any remaining ties for year-end class championship points will be broken by comparing the cumulative PAX scored finishes at the points events in which the tied competitors competed together, excluding Australian Pursuits or any other type of event in which PAX results cannot be obtained
 - e. Members must qualify their points by working at least one event as, or under the supervision of, a specialty chief. Qualified positions include: Safety Steward, Chief of Tech, Registration, Course Design, Chief of Workers, Course Set-Up, Course Tear-Down, or any other position so deemed by the Solo Chairman.
- 3. It will be the responsibility of the Solo II Chairman and/or a designated representative to publish the class points standings toward year-end class points totals twice a year in Clutch Chatter and/or the region web site. The first posting will be after the fourth points event. The second posting will be after the last points event of the season, but before the December Annual Meeting. Year-end awards will not be awarded unless the region conducts a minimum of 3 points events.
- 4. The Jack Tovey Cup Solo2 Champion Award (Tovey Cup) will be presented each year to the Solo competitor earning the most points during the season via PAX scored finishes at each Indianapolis Region points-scoring event. Only Indianapolis Region Solo II points events will be Tovey points-scoring events.
 - A. Australian Pursuits and any other type of event in which PAX results cannot be obtained will not be Tovey points-scoring events.
 - B. For each points-scoring event:

The PAX times used to compute scores will include those of all drivers competing at the event in a recognized SCCA Solo II class.

100 points will be awarded to the individual(s) with the fastest/best PAX time.

Ten points will be awarded to the individual(s) with the slowest/worst PAX time.

Individuals who enter the event but do not receive a time shall receive 10 points unless they are disqualified from that event in which case they shall receive 0 points.

Individuals between those times will be granted points computed as follows: Points awarded =

100 – (90 * (competitor's time - minimum PAX time) / (maximum PAX time - minimum PAX time))

- C. The points for each competitor's worst points-scoring event during the season will be dropped. If the competitor missed one or more events, this could be a score of zero. This allows for non-attendance at a single points event during the season without imposing a penalty.
- D. In the event of a tie, event-by-event PAX finishes shall be compared. The competitor with the most first place finishes shall be judged the winner, or if both have the same number of first place finishes, then the most second place finishes, etc. In the event that all finishes have been compared and competitors are still tied, the PAX times of the tied competitors, counting only events where all tied individuals competed, shall be added. The competitor with the lowest total time shall receive the award.
- E. To be eligible for the Tovey Cup award, the competitor must meet all criteria per Awards rules 2a and 2e above.
- F. The Tovey Cup points standings will be published via either Clutch Chatter or the region web site at least once during the season before the final points-scoring event.

5. A year-end Spirit of Solo Award will be presented to the Solo competitor that did not win a year-end class award, but showed the most enthusiasm, helpfulness, and spirit, and exemplifies what all Solo competitors should be like. This award will be chosen by the Solo Chair(s) after the finals points event of the season, but before the December Activities Meeting.

ROAD RALLY AWARDS

1. General:

- a. All Indianapolis Region road rallies will be year-end counting championship point rallies unless otherwise noted. "Non-point" rallies such as fun rallies will be clearly advertised as such.
- Year-end championship awards will not be awarded unless the region conducts a minimum of three points events.
- Classes of Competition: Classes of competition on points rallies will be determined by the rallymaster and/or the rally chairman. The classes will be drawn from one of the following two groups:
 - a. Group I classes are to be used for TSD (Time, Speed, Distance) rallies.
 - 1. Class "A": Unlimited equipment. Comparable Divisional and National classes are "Equipped" and "Limited."
 - 2. Class "B": Any timekeeping device, stock odometer in stock location, any computer/calculating equipment that does not have automatic input of mileage, tables, or slide rules. Comparable to Divisional class "Stock."
 - 3. Class "C": Any timekeeping device, stock odometer in stock location. No calculating equipment beyond paper and pencil.
 - 4. Class "N": (Novice) Same as Class "C," except that neither the driver or navigator may have had a first place finish where they finished ahead of someone else in class on any SCCA competition rally, nor have been awarded a year-end rally trophy by any SCCA Region when they enter their first event of the season. Any Team that qualifies as a Novice at their first event of the season shall remain a Novice Team for the balance of the season.
 - 5. Historic Class "A": Vehicles must be 25 years or older and use equipment from the period; i.e. Halda Speedpilot, Halda Twinmaster, and Curta calculators.
 - 6. Historic Class "B": Vehicles must be 25 years or older and use equipment from the period; i.e. stock odometers, Steven's Calculators or other slide rule type devices, tables, or paper and pencil.
 - b. Group II classes are to be used for non-TSD rallies rallies sometimes know as gimmick rallies. Examples of this type of rally would be a map rally.
 - 1. Class "E": (Experienced) Combination of Classes "A," "B," and "C" or anybody who is not a novice.
 - 2. Class "N": Same as Group I Class "N"
- Member's Qualified Points: A determination of a member's qualified points for a year-end championship award will be accomplished or affected by the following:
 - A member's best finishes in 75% of the region's declared points events or best 6 finishes, whichever is less, will be counted toward a year-end championship award. Note! - A 75% multiplication factor resulting in a .5 event will be rounded up. Example: 6 events x 75% = 4.5 = 5 events to be counted toward an award. Otherwise, events will round to nearest whole number. The above will be done on a basis of:
 - For rallies with more than one class other than Novice, points will be awarded for class position per the points

For rallies with one class other than Novice, points will be awarded per the points schedule, with the points to be counted in the class giving the competitor the greatest advantage.

Points schedule:

INISHING POSITION	POINTS
1	12
2	9

For a gimmick rally or rally of chance (suck as Poker Run, Yahtzee Rally, etc.), all competitors who finish will be awarded second place points regardless of finishing position.

- b. Points will be counted only for Indianapolis Region members. Anyone who joins on or before September 1st in a given year will receive points for those events run as a non-member. Anyone who joins after September 1st in a given year will receive points only for events run after joining the Indianapolis Region.
- The member must compete in one given class in a minimum of three (3) or 50% of the region's rally points

- events, whichever is less. (Round up for odd number of events).
- d. Both the driver and the navigator will receive the same number of points.
- e. Members must quality their points by working one Indianapolis Rally SCCA event or seek work agreeable to the Rally Chairman, i.e., pre-checking, acting as safety steward. The Rally Chairman will be responsible for keeping a record of those people who have fulfilled the work requirement towards year-end point eligibility.
- f. Members staging or writing a rally; i.e., being a rallymaster, will earn 12 points in the class in which they compete during the majority of the season.
- g. For rallies with only Experienced and Novice classes, competitors must inform the Rally Chair at that rally which class they want to apply their points for year end total. In rallies with all classes, a person can only get points for the class they compete in for that rally.
- 4. Publication of Points:
 - a. The rally chairman will be responsible for tabulating and publishing the points.
 - b. At a minimum, the current points standings will be printed in the regional publication before the next to last scheduled points event.
- 5. Year-end Awards: Year-end awards will be determined per the following format:
 - a. Year-end awards will be awarded to competitors earning the highest points totals by class.
 - b. Competitors eligible to receive awards in more than one class will receive them only in the class giving them the highest year-end finishing position. If the competitor's season ending point totals are the same in two classes, they will receive an award in the higher ranked class. Classes will be ranked in order as follows: A > B > C
 - c. Anyone who qualifies as a novice at the beginning of the season will count all points gained that year toward the novice class standings. (See II.A.4)
 - d. Ties for year-end awards will be broken on the basis of quality of finishes; i.e., number of firsts, seconds, etc.
 - e. The number of awards presented in each class will be per the following awards schedule:

QUALIFIED MEMBERS	<u>AWARDS</u>
1 to 2	1
3 to 6	2
7 to 10	3
11 to 14	4
15 or more	5

6. Junior Award:

- a. Must be under age 18 on February 1st of the award year.
- b. Juniors may be a driver or navigator
- c. At each applicable event, in addition to the class trophy, a Junior trophy will be awarded to the highest placing Junior overall.
- d. 1 year-end Trophy will be given to highest placing Junior overall.

COMPETITOR OF THE YEAR AWARD

Purpose: To encourage participation in all Indianapolis Region points events and to recognize the best performance by an Indy Region of Record member within the Indy Region racing, rally, and solo programs by presenting a year-end trophy. The individual scoring points in at least two categories and earning the greatest number of points throughout the season by these rules will be named Indianapolis Region Competitor of the Year.

- 1. Points will be awarded for class finish (or over-all finish in events with only one class) in racing, rally, and solo events which count for Indianapolis Region Championship points.
- 2. Points will be allocated to competitors finishing ahead of at least one other starter as follows:

9	1

3. The competitors nine best finishes will be counted with no more than four events from any one category of competition.

The points standings will be published at mid-season and at the end of the year.

INVOLVED MEMBER AWARD

The purpose of the Involved member award is to recognize Indy Region members who exhibit exceptional participation during the year. It is not a competition between members. In fact, the more award recipients the better. It is truly a celebration of dedication, support and commitment to Indy Region SCCA.

An Involved member award will be presented to each Indianapolis Region member, 16 years of age and older, who earns a minimum of 800 points in a calendar year by participating in at least two of the following four areas of participation: meetings and other club-sponsored special events, rally, race and solo.

An Involved member award will be presented to each Indianapolis Region junior member, under 16 years of age, who earns a minimum of 400 points in a calendar year by participating in at least two of the areas of participation.

The Involved member award will be an embroidered lightweight jacket or fleece. A member will be awarded a jacket only once in five years. A repeat award will be recognized by embroidering the award year on the jacket.

Points are only awarded for Indy Region events, Cendiv Roundtable, and SCCA National Convention. There will be no combination of points for a single event; points from only one category may be scored per day. For example, a member who is a worker and a driver on the same day at the same event may only score points for one category or the other.

Each member is solely responsible for tracking and reporting their points; no one else will do this for you. To be eligible for an award, the Indy Region member must fill out the form on next page or a reasonable facsimile and mail it or e-mail it to the membership chairman. The form can also be downloaded in Excel format from our website, making tabulation of points easier. The form must be delivered no later than November 15 in order to receive the award at the annual awards banquet. All forms must be received no later than January 10 in order to be eligible for an Involved member award for the year. Confirming receipt of submitted points is the sole responsibility of the entrant. A person's eligibility will be verified by the Membership Chairman.

NOTE: This form can be downloaded as an Excel file from our website to make tabulating and reporting easier.

2005 POINTS RULES CHANGES RECAP

Yes, there were some changes to the points rules for 2005. If you have any questions regarding the rules, please contact the program chairpersons or a board member.

Race: For National Race Competitors awards of National Trophies, the following sentence is added to section 4a. Finishes at the SCCA National Championship Runoffs will be considered an out of division finish. In section 8: deleted "in Clutch Chatter" from end of sentence.

Solo: Solo COTY award has been renamed The Jack Tovey Cup Solo2 Champion Award. SCOTY terminology is changed to Tovey Cup.

Rally: In section 3a: changed points awards for chance rallies, all finishers get 2nd place points. Added section 3g: clarified method of combining points for different classes.

Competitor of the Year: Affected by Rally points changes, otherwise no changes for 2005.

Involved Member: Added/clarified some new points categories, adjusted some points levels.



The Rookie - Part 1

The Geek

Hi, my name's Steve, I'm a car geek. But then again, if you're reading this, you can probably look in the mirror and say the very same thing. Except for maybe the "Steve" part. Many of you know me from either from the Solo2 program or maybe you dodged me while I worked pit-out at IRP. If you saw me at a Rally, it was probably while my allknowing navigator, also known as "The Wife", was critiquing my lack of ability to compute time and distance. But now I have embarked upon the next stage of my SCCA career. In 2005, I finally will pursue my long-time goal of competing in SCCA Club Racing. After some rationalizing, pleading, and begging with The Wife last spring, I began the transformation of my venerable 1992 Nissan Sentra SE-R into my own self-professed "mid-life crisis".

The Car



On a restricted budget of course (did I mention The Wife?), I began the next stage of my "grocery-getter in wolf's clothing" car's life. I purchased my SE-R with less than 200 miles on the clock in April 1992. I spent the next few years making sure it was always nice and clean. In 1998, I started running in Solo2 events. The start of the evolution from car pool hauler and Solo2 car to an ITA spec race car started last summer. First came the "deconstruction". The biggest outlay was a custom LeVair roll cage fabricated and installed by Warren, Michael, and Scott LeVeque. In went a lightly used Sparco seat, new G-Force belts, fire extinguishers, kill switch, and a transponder. Some more wheeling and dealing resulted in extra set of wheels and a new set of Kumho Victoracers. A few skinned knuckles and several months later, the car received its first annual tech inspection and a new logbook. And of course, to go with the car's safety items are my own personal safety items. Again, some more careful shopping resulted in a new 3-layer drivers suit, full face helmet, gloves, shoes and underwear. Budget to date: about \$2000

Evidently the first thing any Solo chairman learns to do is delegate the solo reports for months where there's nothing to report - thus making for a rather boring article. So, proceed at your own risk and do not read this report while operating a motor vehicle or heavy machinery.

Plans for the 2005 season are currently almost complete. We're planning for ten events just like last year starting with a test event in early April, followed by eight points events, and ending with another Worker's Invitational in early November. Classic events such as the ever-popular Australian Pursuit will return in July and we're hoping to continue the tradition of a combined event with Columbus at their site at the Walesboro airfield. And, we're planning to organize another CENDIV event at Grissom as we did last year. 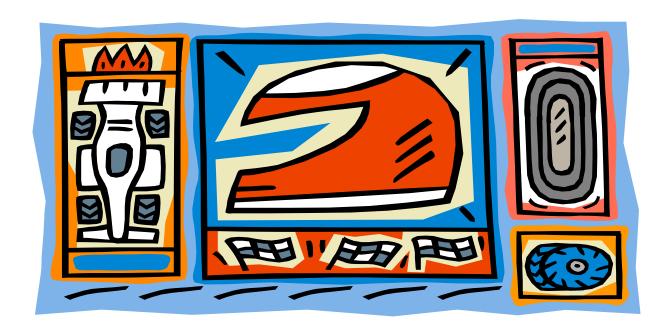

Rally School Part I

The March rally will be the first TSD (Time-Speed-Distance) event of the season. Since some of you fast solo and racer types have discovered that rallys are a good means of compiling those all important Competitor of the Year points, I thought that I would give you a little education about how to be competitive (Bill Partridge already knows this, so if you want to beat him.....)

In a TSD event scoring is done on the basis of your absolute time error at a number of unknown (to you) locations along a specified course of travel. For you nonmathematicians, absolute error does not refer to vodka, it being early as for being late. Suppose that the perfect time for a leg (which is the term for a portion of the course between two consecutive unknown points) is 13.25 minutes, and suppose that one car arrives in 13.20 minutes and another arrives in 13.30 minutes. score 5 points. And like golf, the low score is the winner, so the objective is to get as close to the 13.25 minute official time as possible.

How do you accomplish this? That will be the subject of Official Mileage (OM) = CF x Measured Miles this little series of short lessons.

I mentioned that you are following a defined course and that at points that are not announced to you, there will be Check-points where you will be timed. Your course of travel will include information that can be used for timing purposes. This information is in the form of CASTS (Change Average Speed To) that are referenced to specific points along the course. By measuring the distance that you travel between points, and applying the average speed into a time.

The problem is that your distance measuring device (odometer) will, in 99% of all cases measure the distance differently from the Rallymaster's odometer. Therefore, your calculated time will be different from his and you will get some score different from the desired zero. Since this would be as random as rolling a set of dice, there has to be some way of making your odometer measure the same as the rallymaster's. This method is called the odometer calibration zone, and every TSD rally is In the next lesson we will learn how to apply this number required to begin with one. The National rules call for in calculating your transit times through the course.

this zone to have a minimum length of 12 miles and to be reasonably close to statute miles.

At the beginning of the calibration zone, the rallymaster will give you a very precise location, such as a Stop sign that you have to stop for, and tell you to zero your odometer. If you have a trip odometer, come to a complete stop and reset it. If you do not have a trip odometer, come to a complete stop and write down your main odometer reading, estimating the mileage as closely as possible including hundredths.

means that you score the same number of points for Follow the instructions for driving through the calibration zone and stop at the indicated end point. Write down the final mileage from your trip odometer or main odometer, again estimating hundredths. Subtract your initial mileage from your final mileage to get the number of miles that you measured.

> The equivalency formula is that the rallymasters mileage is equal to a correction factor times your mileage, or

Solving for CF we get

CF = Official Mileage / Measured Miles

Suppose that the instructions indicate that the OM at the end of the calibration zone should be 12.655 miles. Your car does not have a trip odometer, so you write down your initial mileage as 16,542.35 miles. At the end of the calibration zone, your mileage reads 16,554.11 miles. Subtracting, you find that you measured the calibration zone as 12.41 miles. Therefore, your CF is

CF = 12.655 / 12.41 = 1.01974

Do a reasonableness check. You measured fewer miles than the rallymaster. You should indeed multiply your mileage by something greater than one in order to get his number.

Rally Schoo<u>l</u> Part II

By Chuck Hanson

In Part I of this little series, we demonstrated how a competitor goes about calibrating his odometer to read the same as the rallymasters. This is important because all of the calculations that you are going to do for the rest of the event are based on the rallymaster's odometer. If you want to be close, then you have to use the factor and do at least some calculations (Bill Partridge already knows this, so if you want to beat him.....)

I mentioned before that you are following a defined course and that at points that are not announced to you, there will be Check-points where you will be timed. Your course of travel will include information that can be used for timing purposes. This information is in the form of CASTS (Change Average Speed To) that are referenced to specific points along the course. By measuring the distance that you travel between points, and applying the average speed into a time. How is this done? That is the subject of this lesson.

Leaving the calibration zone, and at every succeeding Check-point, you will be given a time of departure. At the beginning of the rally you are given a starting time such as 12 PM (noon) plus your car number in minutes. So, if you are car number four you will start the odometer calibration zone at 12:04 PM. The usual practice is to state that you have some specific amount of time to complete the calibration zone, say 40 minutes. This means that you are to begin the first scored leg of the rally by leaving the end of the calibration zone at 12:44 PM. You do not have any set speed at which to drive the calibration zone, so you are free to start it before 12:04 PM, and drive it at any legal speed that you are comfortable with. You want to be at the end point sufficiently before your 12:44 PM departure time to be able to do your calculations and start with a calm disposition. Being stressed at the start is as hard on your rally score as your golf score.

So, you know that you are leaving the end of the calibration zone at 12:44 PM and the instruction tells you that you can zero your odometer, and that you are to CAST 30. This means that you are to leave at 30 miles per hour.

This is where we have to introduce another esoteric rally term; the minutes per mile factor. We all know that there are 60 minutes in an hour. Therefore, if we are driving at 30 miles per hour it will take us 2 minutes to go each mile. Every speed that you will be asked to drive has a corresponding minutes per mile factor defined as 60 divided by the CAST; i.e.

Minutes / mile = [60 minutes / hour] / [CAST in miles / hour] But wait - There's More: The miles here are the rallymasters miles, so you have to multiply your miles by competitiveness by an order of magnitude.

that correction factor that you calculated. I know, you are saying "Drat! Another calculation." Afraid so, but these calculations can be made at the end of the calibration zone and reused as needed throughout the event. For those who are interested, I have a one page form that I call "Common Data and Calculations" that I will be happy to share with anybody. It gives all the formulas and a place to enter your results, kind of a legal crib sheet. Anyway, the final formula for the M/m factor is:

Your Minutes per your mile = [60 x CF] / [CAST]

In this case, you are leaving the calibration zone at 12:44 PM with a factor of 2.03948 minutes for each mile that you drive (as measured on your odometer).

After driving a mile from the end of the calibration zone the time on your watch should indicate 12:46.04 PM where the fractional minutes are in hundredths of a minute, NOT seconds.

Which introduces another of our esoteric conventions. Arithmetic isn't done in base 60 like a clock. It is done in base 10. When you divide 60 minutes by some arbitrary CAST like 40, the answer is 1.50 which means one and one half minutes or 90 seconds, or one minute and 30 seconds. Converting these back and forth to seconds can be time consuming, so we just stay decimal for all of our calculations. There are watches that are calibrated in decimal (time and motion studies in factories use decimal watches for instance) and several manufacturers make special rally watches that are decimal. In addition, I have done a CAD drawing of a watch face with seconds and hundredths that can be laminated with a cursor, sort of like a circular slide rule to make the conversion. Copies are free to anybody who asks.

At your mileage 1.5 you encounter the first check-point. Using the formula you find that you should have arrived at 12:47.06 PM. You flick your standard stopwatch as you cross the line and read 12:47:03 PM. Congratulations! 3 seconds = 5 hundredths, so you are 1 hundredth off perfect time and score 1 point for the leg. Keep that up and you will do very well.

You will hand in your scorecard to have your official arrival time entered, along with your official time to begin the next leg. This is usually your arrival minute plus four, or 12:51 PM in this example. Repeat the process given here for the next leg.

These procedures are essentially for the Navigator to use in attempting to keep the driver on time. In the next lesson we will discuss how the Driver can stay very close to perfect time with minimal intervention from the Navigator, a talent that will improve the teams

A complete, printable, electronic format copy of Clutch Chatter (including back issues) in Adobe pdf format is available to view or download on the Indy Region website at indyscca.org.

When an issue of Clutch Chatter is completed and ready for publication, the pdf file will be posted out on the Indy Region website and a special notice e-mail will be sent to the Indy Region e-group with a link to the download page. This should be available several days before the mailed copies arrive, since it won't have to go through the printer or the mail.
