At race tracks and autocrosses, I'm drawn to the latest winged, ground effect, supercharged, AMod car or the latest freshly built CP Production Pony car.

People with more sense than I and more competitive juices often criticize my choice of "bastard" cars. The down side to this is the missed events and the embarrassingly large size of my "Folly Wall" which represents all of the failed developments.

I am perfectly aware that so called stock cars come

your dreams and your welding and machine shop.

Much of the discussion on the chat groups is about some theory that was read in a book but not actually applied. We tinkerers have read the same books but don't necessarily believe the theories, until actually applied to our cars and situations. You'd be amazed at how many theories don't apply correctly to our sport. Richard Petty said:" If you cain't prove it you aint!"

That also applies to theories of our own which aren't

When all of we senior citizen racers began, there were no good stock cars and we "had" to modify cars to be successful. It worked for us and there was really no other choice.

When we see wheeled tool wagons beside race cars on the grid, is it because it is necessary or because they just have to adjust something. Once at a Pro Solo a competitor was witnessed changing camshafts between runs-did he really need to?

We once had an engineer in the lab that just always had to tweak an already perfectly running machine even if it then ran worse. We developed a "twiddle" box with lights and dials that did nothing except to satisfy her tweaking urge. Are we there also?

I just pulled out a perfectly running naturally aspirated engine to install an experimental turbo engine. Is that my "twiddle" box?

All of you competitors in Street Mod, Street Prepared, Prepared, and Modified know who you are and why we are in the sport. When these classes are eliminated, so are we.

Look for the unnecessary tool box beside the feet sticking out from under the car. You'll see me there.

Runoffs Qualification Explained

The Runoffs are the SCCA Amateur Championships, with the best drivers from the 8 Divisions in each of the 25 classes competing for the title National Champion. This is an Invitational meet, and the drivers must meet certain qualifications to get the invitation.

The Driver must have qualified for 4 National Races in the year, and Finished 3 of them. At least 2 of the races must have been in the drivers Division of record. A driver who finishes within the top 10 in points, but does not have the required 4 starts, does not qualify for the runoffs. A driver could be 5th in points on only 3 races. Without the 4th race, he is not eligible for the runoffs.

The Driver must be in the top 10 in points in his Division, counting no more than 2 out of Division races, and have a minimum of 4 points. Points are awarded for finishing First (12 Points), 2^{nd} (9), 3^{rd} (7), and decreasing 1 point per position from 4^{th} thru ninth. Only the Drivers best 6 finishes are counted for the points total.

Indy Region Racers To The Runoffs

2006 saw a number (12 plus 1 honorary) of Indy region racers qualify for the runoffs. We have had many National Champions in the past, along with many podium finishers, and this years racers include some of those distinguished people.

If you watched the Touring 2 race on Speed Channel last year, you saw Bill Baten drive a hard race to claim a 4^{th} place finish. Bill got a late start this year, not getting to his first race until June; then he clicked off 6 wins in 6 races, including the June Sprints, to be the T2 CenDiv Champion. I look for Bill to be on the podium this year.

Ralph Porter ran the early part of the year in his venerable Neon, then switched in July to a new Mini. He did well while learning the new car, topping the CenDiv points for SSC, and has had the car "freshened up" for the runoffs. Ralph has done well in previous years with the underpowered Neon, and should move up in the results with the more competitive car.

Bill Partridge also started his season late, and has been fighting a non-responsive car choked down severely by inlet restrictors imposed by SCCA to make the former GT5 cars competitive with the former GT4 cars. Bill still managed to lead in the CenDiv points, and will be a definite contender if he can get the engine acting right.

Gerry Mason started his year in June with a trip to Heartland Park, snagging a solid win on the runoffs track. Gerry only ran the minimum races to qualify for the runoffs, winning 3 of the 4 races, with an equipment failure at the 4th race. Gerry has

had some strong runs in previous years, and the win in June says he can get his Nissan around Heartland Park, so I expect a solid finish among some heavy competition.

Bobby Caldwell has moved from an old IT/Prod BMW to a Formula Continental this year. Even though this is a drastic difference in vehicles and characteristics, Bobby has been remarkable this year, including a solid win at the IRP Nationals, getting to the 5th spot in CenDiv points. Bobby has run on the track with the best in CenDiv, which includes some class National Champions, and his first runoffs should be very interesting.

Brian Doll started the season with some very good wins on wet tracks, continuing the season with a more solid finishes. His older Camaro may not have quite as much as some of the newer cars in the American Sedan class, but Brian gets all it will give. He will make a solid run in the race, and if he gets a wet track at the runoffs, he may surprise everyone with what (he and) that older car can do.

Aaron Ellis was another late starter this year, also only running the minimum races needed to qualify, but making all 4 races podium finishes, including a very strong second at the June Sprints. Aaron has won the F500 Championship before, and has been hungry for a repeat. This could be the year. James Weida also raced in the F500 class this year, getting the 5th place points in CenDiv for his efforts. The runoffs will be a great experience for young James, and he will be learning from the best as he hangs in there with the guys near the front. He hasn't won yet this year, but he has never been out of the front pack at the races.

2006 Indianapolis Region Involved Member Award Rules

The purpose of the Involved Member Award is to recognize Indianapolis Region members who exhibit exceptional participation during the year. It is not a competition between members. In fact, the more award recipients the better. It is truly a celebration of dedication, support and commitment to Indy Region SCCA.

An Involved member award will be presented to each Indianapolis Region member, 16 years of age and older, who earns a minimum of 800 points in a calendar year by participating in at least two of the following four areas of participation: meetings and other club-sponsored special events, rally, race and solo.

An Involved member award will be presented to each Indianapolis Region junior member, under 16 years of age, who earns a minimum of 400 points in a calendar year by participating in at least two of the areas of participation.

The Involved member award will be an embroidered lightweight jacket or fleece. A member will be awarded a jacket only once in every 5 calendar years (example: a winner presented a jacket in 2000 is eligible again in 2005). Repeat awards within the 5 calendar years will be recognized by embroidering of the award year on the jacket.

Points are only awarded for Indy Region events, Great Lakes Roundtable, and SCCA National Convention. There will be no combination of points for a single event; points from only one category may be scored per day. For example, a member who is a worker and a driver on the same day at the same event may only score points for one category or the other. Each member is solely responsible for tracking and reporting their points; no one else will do this for you. To be eligible for an award, the Indy Region member must fill out the attached form or a reasonable facsimile and mail or e-mail it to the Membership Chairman. The form can also be downloaded in Excel format from our website, making tabulation of points easier. All forms must be received no later than December 31st of the year in order to be eligible for an Involved Member Award for that year. Confirming receipt of submitted points is the sole responsibility of the entrant. A person's eligibility will be verified by the Membership Chairman. The IMA will be presented to the winning members at the Annual Awards Banquet for that year.
