



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








CONSTRUCTION DETOUR



The construction project on Interstate 70 in the East half of Indianapolis has restrictions that will affect Racers coming to ORP from the East. NO TRAILERS ARE **ALLOWED** through the construction zone. This requires a planned bypass. Best way is to take I-465 around the South side of Indianapolis, and exit on the West side at the 10th Street Westbound exit.



Continue west 3 miles to Raceway Road, go North 2 miles to County Road 300 N, then West to CR 1000 E. Continue North on 1000 E to the track entrance.

Solo Report: A September to Remember!

Another September to Remember at Mt. Comfort!!

Even on the most "average" day, I have a good time at an autocross. Sure there are the odd days where it's 50 degrees and pouring rain and my car breaks and I'm not quite sure why I'm out there. Then there are days like September 16, at Mt. Comfort where it just couldn't get much better.

During the event set-up at dawn it was a bit cool, but it warmed right up into the mid-70's with a light breeze and that clear fall sky that makes everything stand out in high contrast.

We talk up Mt. Comfort a lot, and it didn't fail to deliver for our combined Indy Region event #7 / Columbus Sports Car Club event #8. The paddock was nicely mowed for us, registration and tech went smoothly, and first car was off at 11:00am. Raleigh and Velma Boreen designed a nice course that ran about 40 seconds. We had a low cone count and cars moved through at a nice pace. By the middle of the first run group we decided to add a fifth run. This pushed our total runs over 600 and we still finished around 5pm.

The hot shoes were out in numbers. FTD was scorched by Jeff Everett in AM with a raw time of 34.995. Gus Hammerly edged out co-driver Geoff Chambers for FTPax with an STS2 indexed time of 29.788. Fast novice was Doug Matulewic in BSP with an indexed time of 31.076.

A few words of thanks to everyone: Grid ran like clockwork because the grid workers AND the drivers were keeping things moving. Also, for those folks who worked the taxiway – a special thanks! We had multiple stoppages while the dogfighters taxied in an out of the hangars. We were torn down in less than 60 seconds after we called in the tear down. We were right back in business in about 3 minutes. Hardly a pause in the action – and we'll get no complaints from the pilots! I also noted that the grounds were kept very clean of paper, and bottles and trash. Great job everyone!!!



If you haven't run at Grissom before, make the effort to attend. It's a little longer drive, but it's 5x the size of Mt. Comfort and, though it's a bit bumpier, the concrete is just as grippy. Larry Harts is the course designer and he's figured out how to miss the rough parts and create really fast flowing courses!

A final "operational" note to competitors. At the July Mt. Comfort event, we held registration open after the shut-off time as we tried to accommodate people who trickled in late. As a result of not being able to finalize the entrants, we couldn't finalize the run/work order, print the grid sheets, etc. and we started over 30 minutes late. At the September event, we had a hard shut off and got things started right on time with far less stress on the organizers in the bus. We felt bad that we had to turn down a few people who arrived after registration closed, but it was important to keep things moving. It's a hard policy to have to enforce, but with the large turnouts I believe everyone would rather have the extra runs. So, please be sure to get to the events on time - we really hate turning people away! Thanks!!

As our events grow in size, the need for volunteers increase! Even if it's the day of the event, let Gus, our worker chief, or the Solo co-chairs know if you're willing to help with T&S, grid, tech, set-up, tear-down, whatever. The more hands we have, the faster the work gets done. Plus you learn more about the way things are run.

Solo Is: Size Matters

Size matters in all things. Lets take people first; to win political elections you must have height and hair. To play football or basketball successfully, you must be tall or large and heavy. To be a jockey or a gymnast, you must be small and light. It's an advantage to be small in a formula car or prototype GT where aerodynamics are important. Remember the bumps in the top for Dan Gurney's head in the GT 40 Lemans car. How about the wide- bodied March for AJ Foyt? Light weight is important for small cars that are not weighed with the driver. Several larger IRL drivers are very concerned about Danica Patrick's 120 pound weight being a significant advantage for her. It used to be that large size and muscle strength were important in Nascar until 1967 when a small muscular Mario Andretti won the Daytona 500. Now medium sized drivers with personal trainers seem to be the ticket.

With the advent of servo mechanisms to assist in steering, acceleration, and braking, nearly any size driver can drive about anything. A lot of ladies are entering the open classes in Solo racing now. Still a large or heavy driver is more competitive in a larger car just due to the problem of balancing the lighter car out.

The main focus in size here is the car size in autocrossing. Other that frontal area, car size is not so important in road racing, many of the very successful cars have very long wheelbases and track widths. I successfully road raced a very large car and am now handicapped in autocrossing by that very sentimental attachment to that road racing car.

Back in the days of local non SCCA clubs, since we had no national guide lines, we did our own classifying, based mostly on personal opinions. I once suggested that we simply measure the left front to right rear diagonal and base it on that. Most said that was just way too simple to work. Today I would have said, just run a tape measure around the entire car and use the circumference for classing. Keeping a record of finishing positions showed the size classing would have worked quite well. The PAX in-

dex record has the potential of helping in classing, but only uses data from the class finishes, not individual cars. Size classing would have certainly worked better than SCCA's first attempt at Solo classing using road racing classing, which didn't consider size at all. To make matters worse the courses were mandated at 8 ft wide gates and 25 ft slaloms. My 15 foot by 6 ft car competed against exactly the same cars that I road raced against; tiny MG Midgets and the original Mini Coopers. It was a disaster. I ultimately built a 60" wide 80" wheel base formula car just to stay involved. Fortunately, the classing was such a disaster that petitioning moved my car to the larger CP Pony car class. It's underpowered, but still a much better solution. I asked a famous Solo car builder what size of car to build. He said "1inch narrower and 1" shorter than the cars used by the people designing the courses". Another answer, of course, is to design events ourselves at the risk of not being "technical" (tight) enough. The best answer for individuals is Marque club racing. Our Corvair club rents locations and has "Pig races" Pig vs Pig-fastest pig wins.

There have been studies done about how much missing a cone too much costs; i.e, 6" too much room costs .1 sec. for each cone. What if you car gives you no choice, it's already 6" wider or you have to drive past the cone another 3 ft. before turning in?

Todays courses are much better, having moved in stages up to 15' gates and 45 ft slaloms. Many courses are much more open than that. Still the smaller cars win, but all have fun and don't feel handicapped.


Most things in life come around in circles. The greatly reduced size (offering only tight Slaloms) and reduced grip of the new National courses has resulted in a knee jerk reaction in some local and regional events. We're coming back to the tight courses and reduced grip of the 80s by designer choice. Looking at some of the results this year at big time events, starting with last years Nationals, the smallest cars in large- car classes are winning.

It must be time to build another tiny car!

The Formula 500's will be the last race on Friday, and Jason Knuteson is hoping to continue his strong running from the end of the season. Although he got a late start this year, he still did well enough to be 2nd in GLDiv for the class. James Weida will also be there, after finishing 4th in GLDiv, and plans to join Jason at the front of the field.

Saturday afternoon will bring out the Formula Continentals for the 6th race, and our own Bobby Caldwell has plans to continue a really great season. Bobby won the GLDiv, ahead of previous National Champion Dave Weitzenhof, and also won the June Sprints, making him one of very few to be eligible for the Triple Crown. John Larue finished 3rd in GLDiv, and knows how to win as a previous FF National Champion, so should be able to join Bobby on the Podium. The competition in FC is very strong, so Bobby and John will definitely have to work for their finishes, and I am really looking forward to seeing a great race.

As soon as they get of the track, Ralph Porter takes on the SSB field in his Mini. Since the Minis got moved from SSC to SSB for this year, Ralph has been battling the giants all year, while trying to get the rules to allow limited slip for the Minis. Not being able to get power off the corners makes it group all year, and hopes to be close enough to get the along with some of John Wilmoths' excellent pictures. podium if the others have problems.

Sunday morning will start with the GT2 cars on the track. Gerry Mason started the season late, his first race of the year being our Nationals at ORP. He continued the season well enough to get 2nd in GLDiv points, and has always been strong at the Runoffs. Look for Gerry to stay in the front bunch, scrapping for the win with the best in the country. The GT2 National Champions from the last 15 years have been from GLDiv and CenDiv, and Gerry is quite used to being on the track with them, and winning enough to keep them honest. Should be another great race for the podium.

The second race of Sunday Morning is for the Touring 2 cars, and Bill Baten will again be pushing his older Camaro for all its worth to scrap with the newer cars for the podium. Bill has finished well at the runoffs the last few years, and I have enjoyed watching him. It should be another fun one to watch!

Sunday afternoon will start with the FV race. Although Chris Jennerjahn finished 3rd in GLDiv, he was not entered for the Runoffs as of this writing. If he enters late, he should be keeping his Mysterian in the front group.

I will again be crewing for John Salisbury in H Production, the first race on Friday Afternoon. John finished 2nd in CenDiv this year, notching 3 wins in 5 races. We had some transmission problems earlier in the year, but expect to have cleared them up. John has been a strong contender at the runoffs for many years, and I expect him to continue running his Austin Healey Sprite in the front of the field. The production fields are very strong in GLDiv and CenDiv, so John has a lot of track time with the National Champions of the last few years, and should be right there with them again this year.

Runoffs Qualification Explained

The Runoffs are the SCCA Amateur Championships, with the best drivers from the 8 Divisions in each of the 25 classes competing for the title National Champion. This is an Invitational meet, and the drivers must meet certain qualifications to get the invitation.

The Driver must have qualified for 4 National Races in the year. and Finished 3 of them. At least 2 of the races must have been in the drivers Division of record. A driver who finishes within the top 10 in points, but does not have the required 4 starts, does not qualify for the runoffs. A driver could be 5th in points on only 3 races. Without the 4th race, he is not eligible for the runoffs.

The Driver must be in the top 10 in points in his Division, counting no more than 2 out of Division races, and have a minimum of 4 points. Points are awarded for finishing First (12 Points), 2nd (9), .3rd (7), and decreasing 1 point per position from 4th thru ninth. Only the Drivers best 6 finishes are counted for the points total.



The Magnificent MG Rally
