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Minutes— July Board of Directors Meeting

This is a synopsis of the minutes of the meeting of the Indy Region BOD July 8, 2010 at Dooley O'Tooles, 6:30 PM. There were 7 directors and 9 guests present. Minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

Treasurers Report Rich emailed the report to everyone before the meeting. After minor discussion, the report was approved.

Clutch Chatter Pauletta requested more articles for the newsletter. She has not been getting reports and results, and cannot get them into the paper unless she gets them. She requested articles by the 15th for the next issue.

Website John has been keeping the website up to date as he receives material. He also requested more material for the website.

Membership Pauletta reported current membership is 437.

Activities Next Club Nite Out is Aug 3 at G.T.Souths. Permanent schedule has been posted on the website and published in Clutch Chatter.

Rally Pauletta read a report from Chuck Hanson. We had 5 cars for the June Rally, with all completing the rally. The July 31 Rally has been pre-checked and is ready for competition. Ron Conrad and Andy Kowalscyk are working with the IU Sports Car Club in Blomington to put on the Spet 25 Rally. The desire is to have an IUSCC event with SCCA Sanction, with participation by our members. Chuck indicated we would recover the sanction/insurance/weekend member costs at \$13 per car. This would be a good way to reach more potential members for future events.

Everyone agrees with Chuck about this, and approves the promotional rate and the event.

Race Dave has contacted John Peterson to cancel out October date for this year, and will be spreading the word by other media methods. We do have the three weekends locked in for 2011, and Dave is continuing to pursue other options for next year.

Solo The National Tour Solo at Grissom was a great success, with 296 entries making runs for time. We had a positive response from everyone, and much favorable comments on the course layout. Raleigh has projected a potential gain for the region. Larry Harts organized the Test 'n Tune, again with very positive response from the competitors. Raleigh also organized a "voluntary donation" per cone hit over the weekend, and collected over \$375 for the SCCA Foundation. He requested Indy Regin add to the collectios to make a total donation of \$500: approved unanimously.

The July 18 Solo at the Connersville Visteon site is proceeding along plans, and the city is conditioning the lot very well for us. The Lions club will be bringing a lunchwagon to the site to serve competitors and everyone. Clemens Berger is designing the course, and Raleigh and Velma will help set up the course on Saturday.

New Business Fort Wayne Region has asked us for help to co-host an 'All Deusenberg Drag Race" near Auburn. They will need an extra timing system for the second lane, and would like to have some of our people to help run the system. The date will be Friday, September 3. The BOD agrees if we can find 2 people to go.

Next BOD meeting scheduled for August 12 at O'Tooles. Meeting was adjourned.

Checkpoint 06_2010

Andy says that we will have a Sept. event. He is working with Ron Conrad to get the recently formed Sports Car Club at Indiana University on board as a co-sponsor of a "back to school" themed event. The event will start in Bloomington and explore some really fun roads in that area. These are roads that we, as a Region haven't explored since the last National event we put on about six years ago. I think that you will find them very enjoyable, especially if the leaves are changing color by then.

The flyer for the August 21 event is posted on the web site. It will be a GTA (untimed) only. This will be a Charity Rally with the profits benefiting the "Connected by 25 Youth Leadership Board." There is a special entry fee for cars with an entrant under the age of 20. Bring your kids! General Instructions for the event will be posted to the web site by Aug. 8 so that you have time to study them before the event. Pre-registration will be accepted by snail mail or email (Gift bags for pre-registration).

By the time you read this, Beat of the Drumm will be history. Ted laid this rally out so that all of the competitors ran exactly the same route, somewhat different than the approach that I have traditionally taken in putting together a "universal" event. Let me know how you like it. Maybe we will do more in this format.

Also, it is time to start thinking about the United States Road Rally Challenge (USRRC) that will be held in October. The host this year is the Washington DC Region and the headquarters will be in Frederick, MD. The area around Frederick is both very scenic and very historic ranging from the Appalachian Mountains to Civil War battlefields. One of the highlights of the DC weekend is the Tour event which is called the Catoctin Monte (Catoctin being the name of a particular mountain). On this event you will be given the exact mileage of each possible checkpoint as well as the perfect Car Zero time. It is your task to cross the checkpoint line at exactly the correct time for your car number. This is a concept where the fancy computers have only a marginal advantage over a stock odometer because the only calculations needed are the correction factor. At this time I am aware of three teams that are planning on attending.

If there is a Checkpoint column next month it will be submitted from somewhere in Canada. I will be off running the summer Alcan5000 (as opposed to the winter Alcan5000). This is a 5000 kilometer, nine day rally that runs in even numbered years and alternates between summer and winter versions. In 2012 it will run in February if anybody is interested.

Rally is one of the oldest forms of competitive activity in SCCA. It is the only one that is a team activity. Come out and give it a try. You may be surprised about how much fun it is.

I used to go to the library in the 60s to view news about the Bill Thomas /Doug Roe Corvair. This was the development car for the 4 carburetor, big valve Corvair engine.

At that time Doug Roe (proving grounds engineer) had taken over the official "skunk works" 1960 corvair that Bill Thomas (of Cheetah fame) had successfully raced for Chevrolet in the USRRC. Doug converted the car to turbocharging and raced it in Arizona hillclimbs and in SCCA races as an A/Sports Racer with many experimental features. At the time I was also racing a Corvair based GT 40 replica in A/Sports Racing.

The car kind of faded from view for a while. Then Fred Bybee, Jime Rice and I towed Jim Schardt's Yenko Stinger to Monterey CA, to see all of the Chevrolet featured racers compete in the world's largest Vintage race at Laguana Seca. There were all of the great Cam Am race cars with Jim Hall and Bruce McClaren. There were also several of the famed Chevrolet Grand Sport Corvettes (Cobra competitors).

But mainly there was the Bill Thomas/ Doug Roe documented, official Chevy Corvair race car. with Doug Roe driving it. The Cactus Corvair Club had restored it. It was racing vs the Can Am Cars, Grand Sport Vettes and Cobras. I had a great conversation with Doug Roe. I couldn't believe my luck. Then it all faded away again for a while. Then in 2003. I met Ed Connelly, the current owner, while competing at a Vintage Hill climb in my Corvair based Roadster.

Did I mention that the Roe Car was used primarily as a Hill Climb car in the middle to late sixties in Arizona? Ed asked me if I wanted to restore the Roe car and had it shipped to me from California. It arrived as a rolling hulk so I used the same library magazines circa 1969 Hot Rod to restore it to. Ed was overwhelmed with some personal problems, so sold the car to me instead of doing the restoration.

After my restoration I raced it in 5 events in 2005, winning 4 of them, including several autocross, track events and one at Portland International Raceway, even setting some records, then put it away. In 2009 the HSR Walter Mitty vintage race(2nd largest in the US) at Road Atlanta invited Corvairs to participate, so I brought the car out again. Classic Motorsports magazine was sponsoring the race and elected to do a five page spread on the BT/DR Corvair, then I put it away again. It has been out to a few local autocrosses to get the moths out only.

This year the car was invited to be shown in the Chevrolet Hall of Fame Museum in Decatur IL. It is setting there now (as of July 11, 2010.) beside a Mecum 1964 Grand Sport Corvette--two factory sponsored Chevrolets setting side by side again.

Indy Region Soloists Bring Home Four National Tour Wins

The SCCA Solo National Tour (Road to Lincoln) made a stop in Peru, IN at the Grissom Aeroplex the weekend of July 2nd through the 4th. Dubbed the "Northern States Championship", it was one of three Tour stops this year to boast such a title. Earlier in the year the Southern States Championships and Western States Championships had already been held. So why the special name? These are one of the special events that count toward winning the newly coveted Solo Triad award. Win a Tour Championship event, win your Division Championship and the National Championship for your class, and you are a Triad winner.
