This is a synopsis of the minutes of the meeting of the Indy Region BOD August 11, 2011 at Dooley O'Tooles, 6:30 PM. There were 9 directors and 5 guests present. Minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

Treasurers Report Rich emailed the report to everyone before the meeting. After minor discussion, the report was approved.

Clutch Chatter Josh has been getting positive feedback in his efforts to get paper copy recipients to opt out. The goal is to become entirely electronic distribution.

Membership Wanda reported current membership is 387.

Activities Dave has been working with Indianapolis Motor Speedway for activities to be in conjunction with the annual Tech Day for 2012, including an electric vehicle rally within the facility.

The next "Garage-In Movie" club event is currently planned for the second weekend in October for Saturday the 8th, with the 15th as an option if timing requires.

Rally The Charity Rally for Aug 14 is ready to run, proceeds will benefit Girls, Incorporated in Indianapolis. The September Rally is ready for pre-check, prepared by Andy Kowalczyk. Ted Drummond is preparing the October Rally again this year for Halloween time. Bruce Gezon has written the November rally for our region and presented to Chuck for pre-check when ready.

We have a Double National Rally on the schedule for June 22 & 23, 2012, based around Cloverdale area. Wendy, Susan, Craig, and Ted will all be actively involved in preparing the rallies and organizing the event(s). We will need more people to work checkpoints for the Nationals; hoping to get more of

our Solo folks interested in helping.

Race Andy has been contacted by Jeff Luckritz, RE of South Bend Region, to host (co-host) a double National Race at Gingerman in 2012. The group discussed the possibilities, and generally agrees we want to have an active Race Program, and co-hosting with SBR has some positive response. We would prefer the event to be before Memorial Day Weekend. Andy will continue to work with Jeff to initiate planning for the possible event.

Solo We had a very good result for hosting the Great Lakes Divisional Championship Solo August 6 & 7, with general positive response from many competitors, and some additional funds for the region. Pauletta Thanked the many Indy Region people who helped run the event. Due to sudden rainout before the trophy presentations, we will be distributing the trophies at other events and mail if needed. Pauletta is sending an email to all the participants, thanking them for attending, and explaining about trophy distributions.

There were also 3 raffles which did not get drawn because of the rainout. These were drawn by other members of the BOD during the meeting, assuring correct drawing procedures. Raleigh and Velma will notify the winners of the Solo Nationals entry, the Solo National Tour Event entry, and the set of Hoosier Tires.

New Business The Great Lakes Division Roundtable will be held in Indianapolis November 4 & 5, 2011. Velma has prepared a flyer as notice, and is sending out to all the regions to include in their newsletters. This includes Hotel Room Rates for the event, and contact information.

Next BOD meeting scheduled for September 9 at O'Tooles. Meeting was adjourned.

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Indy Region Preview-2011 Solo National Championships By: Clemens Burger

It is this time of the year again. The days are getting shorter, the NFL preseason is underway, and we are approaching the Solo National Championships that take place in Lincoln, Nebraska. Nearly 1150 drivers are signed up at this point, twelve of them from Indy Region.

Brandon Lavender will campaign his Mazda Miata in ES, a good-size class with 34 entrants. Raleigh Boreen will run in CSP again, together with his co-driver Dave Feighner from Michigan. Velma Boreen will run the same Boreen Miata in CSPL. Since last year, the Raleigh and Velma have changed from the 13" wheel set-up to 15" wheels. We will see if that change will move them up in the final results.

The rest of the Indy Region contingent will all compete in the modified classes. Dan Stone and I will be running in BM. We will be taking two cars this year to give a few more people the opportunity run in this class. CM will have again the highest number of entries from Indy. After Jimmy Chiu moved out to the West Coast, Jason Proksch has taken the opportunity to run a couple of events in Tom Walgamuth's Reynard and will make the trip to Lincoln with Tom. Nick Myers and Mark Lamm will be taking Nick's VanDiemen after having run Mark's Dulon last year. Will the VanDiemen give them the edge and a shot at a National Championship?

The Brinkerhoffs just had a new, more powerful engine installed. Steve Brinkerhoff will be running his

Ultralite XR7 in DM, together with a new co-driver from Canada. Wanda Brinkerhoff will run the same car in DML. Lee Miller will make the trip to Nationals for the 30th time in order to compete in his Locost 7.

Out of the group making the trip from Indy, Wanda Brinkerhoff and Tom Walgamuth will be Nationals rookies. While Wanda has attended Nationals before to support her husband, she will be driving herself this time around. It will be the first time ever at Nationals for Tom. I am certain that he will come back amazed and impressed. Just like during our local Indy Region events, people will try to find the fastest way through the cones, but everything takes place on a significantly larger scale.

Indy Region Hosts the Great Lakes Divisional

The 2011 Great Lakes Divisional Championship event is now in the history books! This is the first time since 1996, when Saginaw Valley Region hosted the event, that a region has been the host region for the divisional. Since 1997, this event has been put on by the regions in what was CenDiv at the time and now Great Lakes Division. A couple of changes at the beginning of this year within the division were a driving force in having a region step up to host this great event. With the experience that Indy Region has had being involved with the National Tour the past few years, it seemed to be a logical step for us to host the divisional.



The weekend actually started out on Thursday with a group of hard working people from the region make the trip to Grissom to mow grass both in the grassy areas AND on the concrete. Yes, you read that correctly – the



concrete! The course designer, Geoff Chambers, got the courses for Saturday and Sunday laid out and marked. Then it was time for Larry Harts to get his test and tune course set up. There were 19 people there, trying out a variety of changes on their cars or just a chance to run one more time before the event began on



Saturday. Registration started at 5:00, along with a welcome party and a chance to see friends that we haven't seen for a while. Saturday morning was late registration and tech, Dunkin' Donuts for breakfast and then the driver's meeting. At the driver's meeting, one of the two long standing awards in the division that honor soloists was given out. The award is the Lloyd Loring Award, in honor of Lloyd Loring, SBR, and his contributions to solo in CenDiv/GLDiv. The 2011 recipient is John Rogers, a member of South Bend Region and a long time contributor to solo. Congratulations, John! A HUGE thanks goes to Holly "Shiftwell" Schwedler for her beautiful rendition of the national anthem. If you haven't heard her sing yet, you are truly missing something! Then the command – "Racers, start your engines" - let everyone know that it was time to get this party started.

With 130 competitors, the decision was made to have 3 heats. This would allow for enough workers during each heat and enough time for those co-driving to make a driver change. Between the 2nd and 3rd heats, thanks to the sponsorship from Tire Rack, Subway party subs were served to everyone there. The competition was over on Saturday by 4:00, Sunday's course set up and was available for walking shortly after competition.

On Sunday, the decision to change the grid was made and it was the right move. The chief steward and ops stewards had also brought up the idea that three runs may be the way to go. Bad weather was on the radar and was to be at Grissom by early to mid-afternoon. So three runs it was – just like Nationals! Thank goodness

that we went with three runs! The last car was off the course – cars had been released from impound – people were packing up and getting ready to come back for trophy presentation when the skies opened up! The temperature easily dropped 15° in a matter of seconds and the rain was accompanied by lightning and thunder! Needless to say, trophy presentation did not take place. We talked to as many of the competitors as we could and they all understood completely. Trophies will be taken care of after Nationals.



There were three door prizes that were to be given away during trophy presentation but that also did not happen. Indy Region held their monthly board meeting on Thursday, 8-11, and the drawings were made at that time. We had two certificates from the SCCA National office. One was for a 2012 National Championship entry and another one for a 2012 National Tour entry. The two competitors who won those are:
