An Open Letter To The Club Racers of The Indianapolis Region SCCA.

It's time to clear the air. For the past several years our Region has had a Club Race program that could be at best described as dysfunctional. The Board of Directors and several individuals have done everything they could do to try and make the Race program viable again but with no success. The Race program has been in trouble for a long time and now it's nothing more than a points system that racers don't seem to really care about.

How did this come about? I guess you could blame the loss of a viable track in the area to host races at, the economy, the color red, whatever but what really is to blame is the lack of direct involvement by those who directly benefit from the Indianapolis Region having some form of Race program. When I say direct involvement I mean stepping up and taking control of the program you seek and try to make something of it. You can write angry e-mails to me or others on the Board, you can get in my face and tell me how you think the Region doesn't care about you, you can wax poetic about what used to be, but none of that is going to change anything if there aren't people from your discipline willing to step up and volunteer to make something happen. There have been several efforts to reach out to Club Racers in this Region and it's all been basically ignored by those who would benefit. The latest attempt to reach out, happened in late March when the Region hosted an interest meeting on the 28th. This was advertised in Clutch Chatter, on our website, our Facebook page, on the Yahoo Group page, and on the Indianapolis Region section of SCCAForums.com. Most of the Board was in attendance, but only five people who had an actual stake in the outcome of this meeting bothered showing up. And out of those there were only two who weren't already otherwise involved in the Region's program or involved at the Divisional level. And of those two, only one was a "new" face. Two nights before, we held a similar meeting to judge interest in starting a PDX / Time Trial program and the room was filled. In addition, I received multiple e-mails, texts, and calls in support of pursuing this program. Further, many of those people said they were interested in volunteering to help make such a program a reality. We are a member driven CLUB, and clubs function through the involvement of its membership. Our other programs are strong and growing because those who benefit from those programs understand it takes involvement from them outside of entering events to make those events happen. The Board will fight tooth and nail for those programs. Ask people in our Rallycross program, last year we had to fight hard with Division and National to get our program a fair shake. We fought for those members because those members were putting in the work to make the Rallycross program a success.

You want a better Race program? Then folks better start stepping up. I can tell you there's not a lot of support amongst the Board for Club Race. Hosting a race is out of the question. But I can say that the Board would be in favor of an enhanced points system for the racers who call our Region home. There is a points system in place now, the one you're all familiar with for this year. If the results are the same this year as they were last year, then it will probably go away for 2014. Ultimately it's up to you.

















Yes, the John Calhoun profiled in the latest issue of Sportscar is the same John Calhoun that is preparing the Car Club Challenge event. And no, he doesn't have any traps on the Car Club Challenge. This event is a straight forward, do exactly what the instructions says event!

A few words about the Car Club Challenge. John Calhoun, who was a very successful national competitor in the 70's and 80's, came to us a couple of months ago with a proposal to present a Challenge rally for car clubs in Central Indiana, he has identified fifteen clubs. The event will be a "Team" Challenge where clubs enter "Teams" consisting of three rally cars. The cars compete individually in the event, but the "Team" score will be the sum, of the "best two" cars. Low "team" score wins the trophy for their club. At least one car club member must be in each car, and if the car club represents a marque, then they have to compete in a car from that marque.

We are pleased to say that we have nine clubs that have stated that they want to participate, and some of them have asked if they are limited to a single "Team". Answer: NO. In the past week we have been told that the British Motor Car Club is planning on two teams and the Corvette Club is planning on four teams. The BMW Club has three teams already entered. The "challenge" has been made, and accepted.

See Chris Brake's request for help elsewhere and give serious consideration to assisting the Rally Committee in this project that has the potential to help the region grow. Based on the information that I have, we can seriously use another eight volunteers.

New member, Jimmy Simpson, took his 1999 Swift 008 Formula Atlantic from cold Indiana on March 10th to the winner's circle at the Circuit of the America's in Austin, Texas. Jimmy's background includes racing go-karts under the watchful eye of Mark Dismore at New Castle Motorsports Park. He was the Midwest USAC **Rookie of the Year in Ford** Focus Midgets in 2009 and has spent some time racing **USAC National Midgets and** local 410 dirt sprints here on central Indiana's ovals. Jimmy credits his quick rise to success in the Atlantics to the help given to him by his mechanics and engineers, all current or former SCCA members from Indianapolis. They include Richard Moyer who directed things in Jimmy's first race in Sebring where he finished 2nd at the **Turkey Trot in November.** Also California native and former Indycar mechanic, Dan Hammond, who provided the brains behind the team's two 2nd place finishes at the double Nationals at Sebring in January, as well as the win at COTA in March. The COTA facility was absolutely magnificent from both a spectators and racers vantage. The SCCA event was only the third race at the track since its opening, preceded only by the Formula One race last Fall and the Rolex sports car race. It is truly a world class motorsports facility worth the trip if you get the time.

Jimmy looks forward to carrying the Indianapolis Region SCCA banner to Mid-Ohio on June 1st, and then on to Road America for both the June Sprints and hopefully the Runoffs in September.
