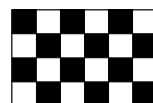
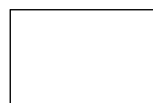
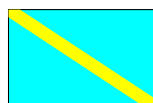

R.E. Report Dave Dusterberg



Remember how I said I was not going to run again for R.E.? Yeah, well, I've had a change of heart. I'd like to come back as your R.E. There are some things in the works I'd like to help see through so if all of you still have faith in me, please vote for me at election time.

On to this month's report:

By the time you read this, the inaugural CAM Challenge will have happened on the last day of the Pro Solo Finale. Why is this important to us here in the Indy region you ask? Well, because our Region and some of its members have had important roles in the development of CAM. The Invitational itself is the brainchild of our own Raleigh Boreen. CAM is a collaborative creation of many people from SCCA as well as the Pro Touring community. The rules for CAM are largely the rules I wrote back in 2012 for a class we called SMC. SMC was an effort on our part to attract people who have Pro Touring style street machines and hot rods. The popularity of Pro Touring style cars has been growing for about the last 10 years and the traditional hot rod and street machine organizations have started holding autocrosses as part of their shows to give a place for people to compete with these machines.

I learned that many of these people had tried SCCA Solo events but due to the custom nature of these machines, they would be classed against pure race cars and have their asses handed to them. That took the fun out of attending SCCA Solos for them. By nature most people with these cars are hyper competitive but it was demoralizing to have their street machine classed against full tilt race cars. So, I created some rules, took them before the Solo Planning Committee and made my pitch. The committee agreed and we added the class. And it went nowhere. I promoted it heavily on pro-touring related websites, hung flyers in local speed shops, irritated every person who I cornered. Meanwhile, SCCA was seeing the same thing. They had hired Raleigh and Velma Boreen to tackle some Solo issues. One of those issues was to find a way to attract Pro Touring cars to SCCA events. Raleigh asked us to add SMC as a supplemental class to the 2013 running of the Peru Match Tour. Never mind we didn't have a single competitor in the class, we did it. So starting with our first event of the 2013 season, I became the classes first competitor and at that first event I worked over every person who showed up in a car that would be legal for SMC. Got 7 people to try it and SMC had a field. I did this for the next few events and soon the class had an average of 5 cars per event and quickly developed SMC devotees. Even with that, I wound up being the only SMC car at Match Tour. The rest of the season went well and SMC crowned its first and only Champion.

In the meantime, Raleigh and several others within the SCCA were attending shows and competition events, talking to competitors and organizers as well as Region officials to come up with ideas for a class.

Several rules packages were proposed including our Region's SMC rules. When SCCA decided to create a class, our Region's rules won the day. They made a few minor changes and CAM was born. CAM has been a big success this year for many Regions. CAM in our Region has become the largest class at our Solo events. The competition is tight right now and the comradery even tighter. Rumor has it the class is going to become a category for 2015. Companies are stepping up to sponsor CAM events, SCCA and other organizations are working together to help each other and keep rules consistent. And to think it all started here. Indy Region SCCA, the birthplace of CAM.

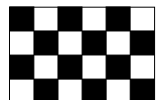
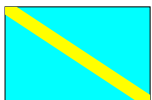

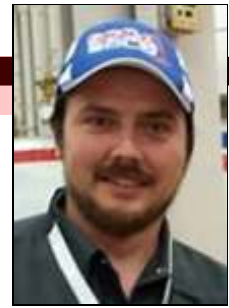

Checkpoint 9-14 Chuck Hanson



I think that it is a certainty that we will be going back to the Lafayette area for more events. We had seven entries for the Windy City Rally, including three with at least some connection to Tippecanoe County. We were probably a month early this year because Purdue students were just arriving on campus this weekend. We are going to work with one of our participants to get connected with the Purdue car clubs. Now if we can just find a connection with INR and South Bend for rally, maybe we can extend the franchise even further.

Rallymaster Andy Kowalczyk treated us to a different format from what we are used to; i.e. the British format referred to as “plot-n-bash.” You are presented with a set of maps, a list of sequential coordinates on the maps. The challenge is to “plot” the coordinates on the map, then figure out the shortest route to sequentially get to these points, and then drive (bash) the course. Oh, and U-Turns are not allowed. GTA folks had questions among the points that they had to attempt to answer. Some of those questions were deliberately “off” course so that we could verify whether the competitors actually took the shortest route. People competing in the “trap” version of the rally had to find the answers to the questions so that they could then take an appropriate pause to include in their time of arrival at the controls. Again, this made it possible for us to determine whether they drove the correct route.

A week ago I did the safety pre-check for the Sept. rally. Cameron Hull has found a wonderful course for his first effort as a rallymaster. We have used some of the roads on previous events (approximately half), but not in the last six years, and most haven’t been used for over ten years. There is some unpaved, but most of it is very good paved. If the leaves have started changing, I think that you will have a very enjoyable ride.

And of course, we are then a month away from the Halloween Rally by Ted Drummond. This is usually the biggest event of our season. Make sure it is on your schedule!!

August was a great month for the Indy Region Solo program! We had our Test N Tune and Points #4 event on August 9th and 10th. There were 49 people at the Test N Tune. Everyone got plenty of runs. I have plans for next year to do something a little different with the Test N Tunes. I would like to set something up to separate those that just want seat time and those that are testing set-ups on their car that need to make adjustments. We'll give it a shot next year, and hopefully can appease to both sets of competitors. The points event was not only a Regional points event, but also a Divisional points event. There were 107 competitors in attendance. Overall, the event went really well. You know it's running smoothly when I can sit and enjoy watching a heat. That wouldn't be possible without the help of my Chiefs.

The month of August also involved the annual Hoosier Challenge. This year it was INR's (Indiana Northwest Region) turn to host the event. There was a record breaking 176 competitors in attendance!!! INR did a great job hosting the event. This is by far the LARGEST event that they have ever hosted, and they handled it with ease. They provided lunch for all of the competitors and even had a tent for some escape from the blistering sun. There were five regions total competing in the Challenge. The final results for the challenge are:

- 4th Place - Indiana Northwest Region (INR)
- 3rd Place - South Bend Region (SBR)

- 1st Place - Indianapolis Region (INDY)

Indy has yet again taken the win. South Bend started a traveling trophy tradition last year, with a Golden Cone. It has returned to the Indy Region, but we challenge all regions to bring as many as they can next year to try and steal it away from us! It was a tighter competition than in the past, but it can get better. Next year it is Indy Region's turn to host the Hoosier Challenge, and Chris and I have some ideas up our sleeves to make it great!

Our next event is going to be on September 14th at the Indianapolis State Fairgrounds. This is going to be our annual charity event in support of 2x2 Rescue. 2x2 Rescue is an animal rescue out of Indianapolis and Merriville, and one of our very own works very closely with them (Casey Szink). We are proud to help out the rescue as much as we can. A portion of your entry fee will be going to 2x2 Rescue. We are also asking competitors to bring some other form of donation. Whether it be money, or supplies for the rescue, anything would be greatly appreciated. Let's all join together and show 2x2 Rescue the Indy Region that I know and love.

Also in September, we will again be hosting the Subaru Challenge. This is taking place on Sunday, September 21 at the Subaru Facility in Lafayette, IN. Can-Am, SCCA racer Dave Causey



David Fairbanks Causey 84, of Carmel, died peacefully on August 16, 2014. Dave attended Berkshire and Park Academies. Dave and his twin brother Dean were owners of Cricklewood Farms which was implemental in many new farming techniques, including hydroponics. In the early 50's he and his brother built a dirt racing track on their farm which led them to their lifetime involvement in racing. Dave became a member of the Indianapolis region of S.C.C.A in 1956, four years later he won his first major race at the Road America 500. Ten years later he was fourth in points for the Canadian-American Challenge Cup, a major feat for an independent driver. He was a longtime member of the Twilight Optimist Club. He enjoyed watching westerns, boating, fishing, gardening and the comfort of family and friends. Dave was a generous, hardworking and fun loving individual. He was preceded in death by his loving wife of 54 years, Barbara and later in life companion, Barbara Curry. He is survived by his children; David Causey, Susan (Bill) McAdams, Tom Causey and Diane Simmerman, grandchildren; Shayna, Alesha, Molly, Will, Maggie, Abby, Ellie, Adam and C.J., several great-grandchildren, sisters; Ruth Johnson, Lucy Grisham and Angela McMillan, sister-in-law, Patty Watson, several

nieces and nephews. He was grandson of Vice President Charles Warren Fairbanks and son-in-law to Paul D. "Tony" Hinkle. Visitation will be Thursday, August 21, 2014 from 4 to 7 p.m. at Flanner and Buchanan Broad Ripple. Services will be Friday, August 22, 2014 at 1 p.m. with calling hour prior at the funeral center. 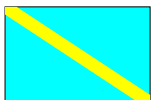
